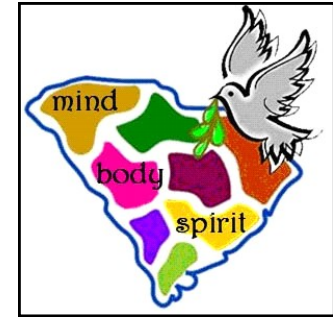
### TRAVEL
